The **Canticle of the Sun**, also known as the *Canticle of the Creatures* or *Laudes Creaturarum* (Praise of the Creatures), is a religious song composed by St Francis of Assisi.

It was written in an Umbrian dialect of Italian, but has since been translated into many languages. It is believed to be among the first works of literature, if not the first, written in Italian.

The Canticle of the Sun in its praise of God thanks Him for such creations as "Brother Sun" and "Sister Water". It is an affirmation of Francis' personal theology as he often referred to animals as brothers and sisters to Mankind.

Most High, all-powerful, good Lord, Yours are the praises, the glory, the honor, and all blessings.

To You alone, Most High, do they belong, and no man is worthy to mention Your name.

Praised be You, my Lord, with all your creatures; especially Brother Sun, who is the day, and through whom You give us light.

And he is beautiful and radiant with great splendor, and bears a likeness to You, Most High One.

Our Founding Story

In the summer of 1947, three FMDM Sisters left England for China. They had been commissioned to work with the Irish Friars Minor in their Franciscan Missionary outreach.

However, with the advancement of the Communist troops in China, the Sisters had to abandon their mission and go to Hong Kong instead, where they stayed with the Maryknoll Sisters.

At that time, they heard that Bishop Olçomendy of Malacca was looking for Sisters to care for tuberculosis patients in Singapore. This disease was both life-threatening and contagious during World War II.

On 7 March 1949, Sister Angela McBrien arrived in Singapore from Hong Kong, followed by Sisters Mary Camillus Walsh and Mary Baptista Hennessy. They took over the tuberculosis wards at Tan Tock Seng Hospital, which eventually became known as Mandalay Road Hospital. They also served the "Lepers Camp", a community of lepers housed in Trafalgar Home at Woodbridge. Both centres were managed as self-contained units as isolation was deemed the best treatment at that time.











In 1952, the Sisters were given an opportunity to start a private hospital to bring nursing care and services to the population. Thus, the FMDM Sisters began canvassing for donations. In addition to pooling their savings and salaries, many generous individuals and companies responded to the call to donate.

On 4 March 1961, the hospital was officially opened with 60 beds. The Sisters who staffed the hospital were professionally trained as nurses, midwives, physiotherapists, radiographers, laboratory technicians and other support services.



The hospital takes its name from La Verna, the mountain in Italy where St Francis of Assisi was believed to have received the Stigmata (an imprint of the five wounds of Christ). He led a life of radical simplicity and joy, sharing God's love for all people and all creation by loving and honouring every person he met, from lepers to sultans and popes to the ordinary townspeople.

Mount Alvernia Hospital today reflects the wisdom and inspiration of our founding Sisters and those who contributed to our organisation.

The hospital remains wholly owned by the FMDM congregation. The leadership team in the United Kingdom ensures that our hospital is compliant with governance guidelines and exercises responsible stewardship.

Our Ethos

Mount Alvernia Hospital is a mission of faith, hope and courage to bring life and light into the lives of people and the community. The work by the FMDM Sisters in 1961 to care for lepers and tuberculosis patients is a call to love all, especially the marginalised and the poor.

At the heart of the Franciscan spirit is a joy that comes from an appreciation for life. This gives rise to a deep commitment to relationships with people and all creation – to be life-giving, all-inclusive and just.

The sacredness of life, the dignity of each individual and the community compel us to live out our values in our work – providing holistic healthcare and raising the quality of care and support for people where needed.

We believe in proactive collaborations and mutual support, partnering with doctors and other healthcare organisations to bring about charity and social service that empower sustained growth in healthcare.

This enables us to appropriately respond to the needs of an ageing population whilst continuing to deliver new life as a hospital reputed for maternity care.

We are a 300 plus bed general acute care health institution with tertiary medical capabilities and multidisciplinary specialist centres. The hospital is supported by over 1,200 accredited doctors with more than 200 specialists located on campus.

As a not-for-profit hospital, Mount Alvernia Hospital channels our surpluses to the communities we serve. Significant efforts are made towards providing outreach healthcare services to the underserved in the community.

The hospital is part of the FMDM global network spanning Singapore, Malaysia, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Italy, Australia, Nigeria, Southern Africa – reaching out to the sick, the poor and the marginalised through healthcare, pastoral care, counselling, education, as well as prison and parish ministries.



Message from Sr Jane Bertelsen FMDM

As we successfully transitioned to live with COVID-19 towards the end of the year, I am proud that Mount Alvernia Hospital was awarded the President's Certificate of Commendation (COVID-19) by the Prime Minister's Office. The certification is awarded in recognition of the exceptional efforts that we have made in contributing to Singapore's fight against COVID-19.

Individually, 16 colleagues, including James, the Chief Executive Officer were recipients of the Public Service Medal. My heartfelt congratulations to James and the awardees and everyone else who have made significant contributions during the challenging COVID-19 period.

Besides, the President's Certificate of Commendation (COVID-19) 2 of our nurses, assistant director of nursing, Adeline Kooh and senior nurse manager, Agnes Dass were accorded the Nurses' Merit Awards while 91 staff from the various departments of MAH were awarded the Singapore Health Quality Service Awards (SHQSA). Well done!

It was also an enriching Mission Formation year as many staff could once again participate in the mission formation programmes in-person. Mission Formation has always been an important aspect of MAH in terms of integrating our mission and values as our way of being. MAH staff in various leadership positions immersed themselves together with colleagues from Assisi Hospice, in the Mission Formation programme that took place in the Franciscan Missionaries of the Divine Motherhood Motherhouse in the United Kingdom, Surrey.

Board Members and Executive Team of MAH, also came together with Assisi Hospice, Mount Miriam Cancer Hospital, Penang and the Canonical Stewards of Catholic Health

Care Asia, for a one-day mission retreat to jointly reflect and share out thoughts based on the theme, "Crafting Our Future Together - Responding with My Abilities". These sessions strengthened and deepened our shared Franciscan mission that was passed down to us by our FMDM founding Sisters.

Continuing on the legacy of the founding Sisters, we persisted in our quest to help the underserved community. As soon as COVID-19 restrictions were lifted, the Community Outreach team set about swiftly to serve the community. By the end of the year, we have reached out to more than 4,700 unique lives through our various outreach programmes. The team also formed new partnerships with the community of visually and hearing impaired – the Singapore Association of the Visually Handicapped (SAVH) and The Singapore Association for the Deaf (SADeaf) – a first for our Community Outreach department. Members of both associations received our health screening service as well as care at our medical and dental outreach clinics.

I look forward to year 2023 with much optimism with our new 10-storey St Anne Mother and Child Centre opening its door by third quarter next year, and I am certain that the MAH team will continue to give their upmost best to serve all with love.

Message from Dr James Lam Kian Ming



The past 3 years have been a challenging one – coping with the COVID-19 virus that upended our lives as we knew it. There were numerous MOH briefings, circulars and unending modifications to visitor policies. The safe management measures that were put in place in all public and private establishments caused economic, personal and mental challenges. When we were finally able to stand down our COVID-19 wards in Nov 2022, we had come out of the pandemic with a team spirit strengthened from fighting in the trenches and a resilience forged in fire.

Despite these challenges, we started and ended 2022 on a high with our staff receiving 2 individual gold and 89 silver awards at the Singapore Health Quality Service Awards (SHQSA) and the President's Certificate of Commendation (COVID-19) for our efforts in helping the nation battle COVID-19. 16 colleagues were also accorded The Public Service Medal in recognition for our individual contribution during the pandemic. We are truly humbled and honoured to be given this privilege to serve.

Two of our veteran nurses also did us proud in being awarded the Nurses' Merit Award. Assistant Director, Nursing, Adeline Kooh and Senior Nurse Manager, Agnes Dass, were given the award by the Ministry of Health. In its 46th year, this award is one of the highest nursing accolades in the country. I congratulate Adeline and Agnes as they continue to elevate and inspire their nursing peers through their hard work, professionalism and service excellence.

Being a staff-centric hospital, we are constantly looking out for ways to encourage and inspire our colleagues to do better. The Values-in-Practice (VIP) award is presented to team members who live out our hospital's core values of compassion, humility, integrity, respect and peace, through their work and interaction with patients and other colleagues. Let me congratulate the 12 winners of our 18th Values-in-Practice (VIP) award. You really do us proud!

We also acknowledged staff who have served in Alvernia for five years or more. Out of more than 100 colleagues who were eligible for the award, five stood out as they had served 40 to 50 years. Our heartfelt gratitude to Irene Koh and S Krishna who both served 40 years, Goh Mui Peng, 45 years and Tan Kim Yeok and Loo Poh Chin – 50 years! We are amazed by your dedication and commitment to Alvernia - thank you so much!

Apart from our colleagues, we always seek to give back to the community just as our FMDM Sisters did. The Community Outreach team sought out the visually and hearing impaired community from SAVH and SADeaf to offer complimentary health and dental screenings to kick-start their healthcare journeys. In 2022 alone, we managed to touch 2,431 individual lives through our medical and dental clinics, hospital-based and offsite programmes.

As life progressively returns to normalcy, I am happy to share that our two major projects that will take us further into the future are on track. We watch with delight the construction of our new 10-storey mother and children building – the St Anne Mother and Child Centre (SAMCC), that was significantly delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic. The completion of SAMCC will present three floors of maternity wards and two floors of paediatric wards – both with single and double beds, delivery suites as well as a parent craft centre among other services and facilities. We are anticipating a soft opening sometime in June 2023.

The new integrated oncology services centre – ICON Cancer Centre opened its doors end 2022 at Medical Centre E with its official opening planned for January 2023. This centre will provide a one-stop service for patients seeking the convenience and privacy of a private healthcare setting at reasonable prices. This extends our clinical offerings and marks another step forward in our mission to care for our community. We look forward to elevating the standard of cancer care at Mount Alvernia Hospital and for Singaporeans.

As I reflect on 2022, I'm filled with gratitude and would like to thank everyone who have weathered the pandemic storm with us – to our Board members for their guidance and being supportive of our ideas; and to all our colleagues who have been fighting in the trenches with me. Finally, to our doctors and partners who rallied with us and we have thrived! Your belief and trust in us have allowed us to continue to Serve all with Love. Thank you from the bottom of my heart and here's wishing everyone good health and a blessed 2023.

Reserves Policy

The Hospital shall maintain a minimum Reserves level of S\$70m ("Reserves"). This is to be reviewed on a yearly basis or as and when needed. Utilisation of the "Reserves" shall be subject to the Board's approval.

Governance

Governance and leadership structures are in place to guide us in providing quality services as well as exercising responsible stewardship, accountability and controls.

The Board members are appointed by the Trustees of the hospital, acting on behalf of the FMDM Congregation, for a term of three years. The appointment is renewable for up to two terms.

The Board provides oversight in the following areas:

- Approval of broad policies, strategies and objectives for the hospital
- Corporate & clinical governance
- Monitoring of management performance
- Approval of annual budgets
- Overseeing the processes for evaluating the adequacy of internal controls, financial reporting and compliance and clinical system design improvements

To assist in the execution of its responsibilities, the Board has established seven committees, namely:

- Audit & Risk Management Committee (ARMC)
- Ethics Committee (EC)
- Finance Committee (FC)
- Hospital Development Committee (HDC)
- Medical Advisory Board (MAB)
- Nomination & Remuneration Committee (NRC)
- Technology Strategy Committee (TSC)

The MAB is elected by medical specialists and appointed by the Board to provide oversight of clinical governance matters. The Chairman of the MAB is also a member of the Board.



As at 31 December 2022, the Hospital has a total headcount of 1,032 staff.




Inpatient Admissions




Outpatient Visits




Surgeries Performed





Reflecting 61 Years of Care and Service to All

1961

On 4 March, Mount Alvernia Hospital started as a 60-bed hospital entirely staffed by the FMDM Sisters who were trained nurses. The first baby was delivered at the hospital on 12 March 1961.



2018 - 2019

Alvernia Endoscopy Centre was redesigned into a one-stop service facility, with a minor operating theatre so that patients could undergo colonoscopy and follow-up with other minor surgeries within the same premises.

Our electronic medical records system, christened HealthAngel, went 'live'. HealthAngel would enhanced hospital operations and be integrated into the national healthcare network.

Partnered with Prudential to allowed patients to enjoy the convenience of cashless medical service.

A new wing was added to St Francis Ward with two sets of two-bedders and four-bedders, bringing our bed count to more than 300.

Began construction of a new maternity and paediatrics centre, to be ready in 2023.

2016 - 2017

The Laboratory Services were redeveloped and expanded to provide increased capabilities and procedures, based on the most contemporary medical laboratory systems.

Second outreach clinic comprising medical and dental services opened at Agape Village in Toa Payoh.

Successful transition from ISO 2008 standards to ISO 2015 standards hospital-wide.

2015

The opening of St Dominic medical and surgical ward and St Michael maternity ward provided additional bed capacity, to reduce waiting time and increase inpatient admissions.

Officially opened our first outreach medical clinic at the Enabling Village located at Redhill, to provide healthcare services to people with disability, the elderly and financially needy residents.



2020

Together as one Mount Alvernia Hospital family, we battle the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. St Clare was converted into a COVID-19 ward.

Hosted the groundbreaking ceremony for the Integrated Oncology Service Centre (IOSC), a partnership between Icon Cancer Centre and Mount Alvernia Hospital.





2021

Celebrated our 60th Anniversary with a series of virtual and live events with safe distancing measures put in place.

Inspired by the precision, reduced complications and faster recovery for patients, we branched into robotic-assisted surgery using the da Vinci System.



1965 - 1971

The late Mr Lee Kuan Yew officially opened a new five-storey wing, which brought the total number of hospital beds to 127.

By 1971, three extensions of the building had been added and were officially opened by the late Mr Lee Kuan Yew.



1985

The Clinical Pastoral Care Department was established, as part of holistic care to support patients and their relatives.



1996 – 1997

Medical Centre A was opened, adding medical suites, operating theatres, delivery suites, an endoscopy centre and rehabilitation centre to the hospital.

More medical suites were added with the completion of Medical Centre B.

The total number of licensed beds was increased to 303.

2004

The Day Surgery Centre and the 24-hour Walk-in Clinic and Emergency Services were opened and ready to serve the public.

2014

Mr Gan Kim Yong, Minister for Health and Archbishop William Goh, officially opened Medical Centre D. The number of on-campus specialist clinics was increased to 89.



2011 - 2013

Launched the Mammography Screening Centre.

Emeritus Archbishop Nicholas Chia officially opened our newlyrenovated chapel.

Became the first hospital in Singapore to expand our magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) services for prostate, breast and magnetic resonance angiography (MRA), with the new 3 Tesla MRI digital scanner with Ambient Experience.



2009 - 2010

A hospital-wide community outreach programme was officially launched to bring health screening services to the poor and needy.

Alvernia Parentcraft Centre, a dedicated one-stop centre for antenatal care, childbirth education and newborn care, was launched

2022

Awarded the President's Certificate of Commendation (COVID-19) for our efforts at battling COVID-19 as an institution. Dr James Lam and 15 other colleagues were also individually accorded The Public Service Medal in recognition for their contribution.

Catching the Dream and the Call to Mission

Mission Formation in Ladywell Convent, UK

The FMDM Mission Formation programme in Ladywell Convent, UK was started as an immersion programme to invite board and staff members of the three healthcare ministries, namely – Mount Alvernia Hospital, Assisi Hospice, both in Singapore, and Mount Miriam Cancer Hospital in Penang to visit the motherhouse of the Sisters of the Franciscan Missionaries of the Divine Motherhood (FMDM), the congregation that founded these ministries.

This annual trip is a time of sharing mission stories with the hope that as the participants heard from the sisters who had worked in the healthcare ministries before them as well as their stories of missions as far away as Africa; the board and staff members would be able to catch the Spirit of our shared mission and the dream started by St Francis of Assisi, Italy in the 1200s.

This year, staff members in various leadership positions, five each from Mount Alvernia Hospital and Assisi Hospice made the trip to Ladywell in Godalming, Surrey, UK. It was timed to coincide with the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, a time of reflection and celebration for all Franciscans around the world.





Aptly, the formation programme began with an invitation to reflect on a reading from 2 Timothy 1:6-8,13-14:

I am reminding you to fan into a flame the gift that God gave you when I laid my hands on you. God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the Spirit of power, and love, and self-control... Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

It was an invitation to a time of reflection on each one's personal ministry in Catholic Health Care, as an opportunity to fan into a flame the gift that God gave each staff member when they chose to join the mission. God's gift is not a spirit of timidity, but the spirit of empowerment, love, and self-control to bear the hardships, relying on the power of God.

Feast of the Stigmata of St Francis

Moments of Reflections with Our FMDM Family

Some 200 staff from Mount Alvernia Hospital, Assisi Hospice, Mount Miriam Cancer Hospital, Penang and FMDM Sisters came together on Friday, 16 September 2022 to mark the Feast of the Stigmata of St Francis of Assisi, with sharing from Friar Derrick Yap, OFM.

Friar Derrick's talk introduced the story of St Francis who sought solace on Italy's Mount Alvernia when he was troubled. We too are invited to come away to seek comfort

and get 'filled' again in the midst of our busyness. He encouraged all to view events like this as a 'good time' to reflect on our desires and hopes for work and ministry.

Friar Derrick also shared that in our daily engagement with others, we are called to touch and encounter everyone in a holistic and integrated way. It was a timely reminder for us to connect with each other through a relationship of listening and dialogue.

Clinical Pastoral Care

Responding with compassionate presence & contemplative listening

The Clinical Pastoral Care (CPC) Team grew with new staff members on board who brought with them their gifts of new experiences and skills; thus, enabling the CPC team to move into service development to better serve the needs of growing patient segments and profiles.

The team challenged themselves to explore how there might be ways to innovate and improve, for example, the provision of care for patients in Day Wards. In the past, due to the patients' short stay in the wards before and after they were wheeled in and out of surgery, CPC was not able to reach many of the patients. CPC staff assigned to cover Day Wards then took to trying to focus on the type of procedures (e.g. evacuation of uterus, biopsies) to prioritise who to visit, in between attending to patients in other types of wards. Even with that, they missed patients because it was not always possible to anticipate discharge timings.

Since July 2022, a turning point was achieved by repositioning the CPC counsellor to be stationed at the Triage area and the initial touchpoint became when patients stepped into the ward. With that, CPC staff was able to give a warm assurance to each patient who came to the ward, and their accompanying caregiver. They were able to assess who to prioritise for further follow up bedside visits.



As a result, the CPC Team has been able to attend to an average of 200 Day Ward patients each month as compared to only double-digit figures in previous years.

CPC support for patients of the Alvernia Obstetrics Screening Centre (AOSC) was also improved to better place the work of spiritual support in the context of the clinical process, taking into consideration the different scenarios where the Centre can make a CPC referral. The request for CPC support continues to be strong, as patients recognise their need for emotional and spiritual support during a time of crisis.

In the pipeline, we are also working on supporting the specialised services for the new cancer centre, geriatric and paediatric care, and also collaborating with CQII/Nursing team to develop a Plan of Care programme that will help patients develop their advanced care plan.

With the different projects in place, the team will continue to upskill and reskill. Five of our CPC team members have attended the Interprofessional Spiritual Care Education Curriculum (ISPEC) organised by George Washington University's Institute of Spirituality of Health. It is a trainthe-trainer programme which focuses on promoting interprofessional spiritual care. Team members also continue to receive ongoing Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) training as well as professional supervision.

Senior Staff Nurse Rebecca Yap was given the 'Salt & Light Award', presented to her by our CEO Dr James Lam at our 2022 Nurses' Day celebration.

Fondly known as the 'sunshine' of her ward, Rebecca shared that she was sincerely touched by the appreciation from colleagues, and this award was a testament to their support.



She shared, "In my five years with the hospital, there were many occasions when I have appreciated our friendly culture, especially with its generous sharing and kind praises."

Rebecca added," New relationships begin whenever I meet new people who become friends. Whether it is a patient, family member or colleague, sometimes it is just about paying attention or giving reassurances when they are worried. I am so happy just to be there for them. As a team, we also share our knowledge and experiences and grow together. That's why relationships matter most".

Caring for our Visually and Hearing Impaired Friends

The Mount Alvernia Hospital Community Outreach team offered complimentary health and dental screenings to visually impaired and deaf clients, to kick-start their healthcare journeys.



Off-site Health Screening at Singapore Association of the Visually Handicapped (SAVH)

To encourage the visually impaired (VI) to rekindle relationships post-pandemic, and help those who required healthcare intervention, Mount Alvernia Hospital Community Outreach team gathered the community through a subsidised health screening.

On 3 September 2022, a road show was held at the SAVH headquarters, introducing the outreach clinic and its services. This enabled our team to build rapport with the VI community in a familiar environment.



The team served about 40 SAVH clients aged 30 and above, who were not on any regular follow up for their chronic medical conditions, and had a family history of chronic medical conditions. After the screenings, participants were treated to light refreshments and a goodie bag prepared by Mount Alvernia Hospital.

To further educate our VI friends, their post-health screening reviews were conducted on 20, 22 and 26 September 22 at Mount Alvernia Outreach Clinic (MAOC) at the Enabling Village, Lengkok Bahru.

Health Screening Campaigns for SADeaf Members

In conjunction with International Week of Deaf People 2022, the Community Outreach team collaborated with the Singapore Association for the Deaf (SADeaf) to organise three campaigns during September and October 2022.

The Outreach team prepared posters and blurbs for SADeaf to publicise the campaigns via email and on their Facebook page. Within four days of the launch, the free flu vaccination for 50 people were snapped up. The 100 free dental scaling and polishing slots were filled by the second day.

To allow as many of our deaf friends to benefit from the health screening campaign, unlimited slots were offered from 12 September to 31 October, including screening for obesity, high blood pressure, cholesterol and diabetes.

After their first visit, SADeaf members shared that they now felt encouraged to take charge of their health, and became aware that they could enjoy subsidised healthcare services beyond the campaign period.

Early Detection Tests For Our Underserved Community

Our Community Outreach team brought health screening to residents staying at rental flats near our medical clinic at Enabling Village. This was a collaboration with Beyond Social Services through their community-led Healthy You & Me initiative.

To enable healthcare access and encourage female residents to take charge of their health, a basic health check including a mammogram screening on the Mammobus for eligible female residents was organised. MAH subsidised the fees further for participants, who eventually paid between \$0 and \$20.

All screenings were successfully completed within the month of June, with event preparations and resident engagement beginning as early as March. A total of 28 lives were touched. Four participants were also detected with undiagnosed chronic medical conditions and referred to our doctors at the medical clinic.

To further protect the community from the seasonal flu, 80 flu vaccination shots subsidised by MAH were offered to the residents and their families at the clinic.



The National Awards (COVID-19)

The National Awards (COVID-19) recognise individuals and teams who have made outstanding contributions to Singapore's fight against the COVID-19 pandemic. About 9,500 individuals and 480 teams received the awards in 9 categories.



We were accorded the President's Certificate of Commendation (COVID-19) as an institution for our contribution towards helping the nation fight the pandemic. Within Mount Alvernia Hospital, 16 other individuals including our CEO Dr Lam were accorded the Public Service Medal (COVID-19).

Meeting the Needs of Generations



Since its sod-turning ceremony in 2019, we have been anticipating the opening of St Anne Mother & Child Centre (SAMCC). This 10-storey building dedicated to women and children is a significant milestone in our 60+ year history. Alvernia has always been known, by word of mouth, as a maternity hospital, with its inimitable baby blessing and send-off by our Nursing and Clinical Pastoral Care colleagues (a tradition started by our FMDM Sisters).





As we look forward to the next 60 years, we want to continue meeting the needs of generations with modern facilities and processes, combined with unique traditions and time-honoured core values.

Augmenting our medical and surgical specialties, the 2-storey Integrated Oncology Services Centre (IOSC), run by Icon Cancer Centre, was opened for service in Dec 2022. This marks another step forward in our mission to care for our community.



Pictorial Advice for Falls Prevention

After surgery, patients are at a high risk for falls. To mitigate this risk, during patients' pre-operations preparation, Day Ward nurses would educate them and their next-of-kin (NOK) about falls prevention and how both parties could contribute to the patients' safety.

The Day Ward team and Falls Risk Committee also designed a pictorial guide on **Fall Prevention**. It serves as a visual aid to further illustrate the information shared with our patients and their NOK for their understanding and cooperation.

Pictorial Guide for Paediatric Airway Management

In our continuous effort to enhance patient safety and provide quality care to our patients, our ICU team created the following:

- Designated 1 ventilator and 1 high flow oxygen device and labelled specially for Paediatric emergency usage
- Created 3 resource charts to guide paediatric airway management and ventilator/device set up guide

Living Matters - Advance Care Planning

Serving All with Love, our Alvernia mission towards providing quality care to all.

In line with the national initiative in promoting an open conversation between patients, their family and healthcare providers, an Advance Care Planning (ACP) workgroup was formed. Comprising staff from Centre for Quality Informatics and Innovation, Nursing and Pastoral Care, the workgroup worked on patients' future care preferences should they become very ill one day.

In end 2022, our ACP workgroup had attended a 3-part facilitator training programme via e-learning with the Agency for Integrated Care (AIC). They learnt the facilitation skills needed on interacting with end-stage patients and their family with enhanced empathy – skills which were useful in managing medical interactions and communicating their end-stage health decision making.

Current Programmes Revamped, New Programmes Launched

As we position Alvernia as the Employer of Choice, our human resource colleagues have been hard at work launching and revamping programmes for new and current staff.

First up is the New Staff Orientation, a comprehensive 1-day programme covering every department of the hospital and essential information for employees. This ongoing programme involves presentations by individual department representatives, interactive team activities and quizzes to reinforce learning.



New Staff Check-in is a new programme to help us understand how new employees are coping in the new work environment and to gather their feedback. This session benefits both employer and employees, as it enables us to address employee concerns and use feedback to implement improvements.

The Student Nurses Engagement Sessions create awareness of Alvernia as an Employer of Choice, and attract interested students to work at Alvernia after graduation. These sessions serve as a valuable platform for the students to ask questions and gain a better understanding of Alvernia's sponsorship programme and career progression tracks.



Local and overseas recruitment exercises were also conducted. Collaborating with e2i and the School of Health and Social Sciences at Nanyang Polytechnic, our human resource colleagues went on recruitment drives in May and November at the respective career fairs. Some staff were recruited at a recruitment trip to Kuala Lumpur as well.



These recruitments are also in anticipation of the opening of the new 10-storey St Anne Mother & Child Centre, which will house three maternity wards and two paediatric wards.

New Medical Record Tracking (MRT)


Our Medical Record Tracking system went live on 29 August 2022, a collaboration between Technology and Strategy (T&S) and Centre for Quality Informatics and Innovation. T&S developed the system, conducted user training and supported users when the system went live.

Previously, records borrowed were written manually in a record book. The Medical Records Office (MRO) had no

traceability when medical records were transferred, and records were not returned on time.

The new system now eases users in tracking borrowed medical records, and informs users of overdue loans. The Medical Records Office (MRO) can also follow up with the borrowers.

Registration of Birth & Death



In response to the government's initiative in streamlining our birth and death registration, Alvernia has introduced a seamless digital birth & death certification process. The team worked to coincide with the nationwide launch of digital certificates on 29 May 2022. The system is named RoB (Registration of Birth) and RoD (Registration of Death), proprietary to and hosted in Alvernia, and used 24x7 whenever there is a birth or death.

Digital Tagging of Medical Assets

To track the movements of medical equipment in St Clare ward, our Biomedical-Engineering (BME) team came up with an asset tracking system.

The project was done in collaboration with medical technology product company Dräger. With Dräger's

software, all medical equipment in St Clare ward was physically tagged and multiple "observers" were placed throughout the ward to give full coverage.

Now, both nursing and BME staff are able to locate medical devices efficiently and can save on searching hours.

Blood Bank: In-house Group and Cross Match

On 5 January 2022, we became the first private hospital to achieve the setting up of an in-house group and cross match services at Alvernia's Laboratory Blood Bank.

Through this new setup, a limited amount of blood products are stored at the hospital Blood Bank. This speeds up the process of issuing blood to patients.

The project started in December 2020, and involved renovation to the current space to accommodate more laboratory equipment, working space for staff and IT configuration. Staff were also trained by HSA to increase their competency, ensuring accuracy and quality of the services provided.

Reskilling Our Housekeepers

Since the 2nd half of 2022, our inpatient meals - traditionally served by our nurses - have been taken over by our housekeepers.

In doing so, our housekeepers become diversely skilled in areas other than housekeeping. This also allows our nurses

to focus more on nursing duties and direct patient care.

We conducted a pilot run in St Michael ward, which was well received by patients. Subsequently, we rolled out the meal-serving service progressively to the other wards.
